# ANSWERS & EXPLANATIONS

Question Number 1 Correct Option a

## Explanation

If we use the word pigeon, it implies that we are comparing hen's egg with a pigeon rather than comparing hen's egg with pigeon's egg.

Hence, A is correct.

Question Number 2 Correct Option a

## Explanation

Sternly means in a serious and severe manner.

- Casually means in a relaxed and informal way.
- Actively means in a deliberate and positive way.
- Vigorously means in a way that involves physical strength.
- Sincerely means genuine way.

Hence, casually is the correct antonym.

## Explanation

Preposition "by" means close to, beside, next to.

Preposition "in" is used to indicate location, place, colour, size or doing something.

Usage: *The painting is mostly in red.*

Option D makes the sentence grammatically incorrect.

- We use *very* before adjectives to intensify emphasis. For example: *He is very strong*. In English grammar, we can use *much* not *very* to increase focus on comparative adjective. For example: *He is very much stronger than William*.

- Similarly, *bit* can not commonly used to modify comparative adjective. Even if it is used, we use *a bit* not *bit*.

According to above explanation, Option B is the correct choice

- Compound sentence: A compound sentence is the one that comprise of two independent clauses. In our question above: *I went to the market. I brought fruits and vegetables.* A compound sentence can be joined by introducing a coordinating conjunction (and, but, etc) or a comma.

- It is important to note that when you have a compound sentence where both clauses have the same subject (in our question above subject is "I") in such a situation we omit the subject from second clause after coordinating conjunction. The right sentence would be *I went to the market and brought fruits and vegetables.*

Question Number	61	Correct Option	c
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#### Explanation

We need to understand the following concept to deal with the question

-Compound sentence: A compound sentence is a sentence that comprises of two independent clauses. For example *David who is a careless pupil, David/He lost his book during the funfair*. A compound sentence usually involves more than one subject (a subject is a doer in the sentence. In the question, David is the only subject).

- Independent sentences have related ideas and can be joined together by a comma or conjunction. When we join two independent sentences with only one subject in it (In our question, David is only one subject and after comma we use *he* as a pronoun to relate to David). We do not mention the subject again after a comma or conjunction. The right sentence would be '*David, who is a careless pupil, lost his book during the funfair.*'

The question is subject to wrong repetition of the subject, so *he* cannot be used in this sentence, while other options are correct.

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#### Explanation

- Doted means shower with love.

Sample sentence: *Asma was the youngest sibling, everyone doted on her.*

- Imparted means transmit knowledge or skills.

**Explanation**

Before we understand the rule that applies to sentence in the question, we need to understand a few concepts.

- Collective Nouns: A collective noun is a name used for a number of people, animals or things. For example: A pack of wolves, Jury, team etc.

Rule:

- A collective noun usually takes a singular noun, but when the members/components of collective noun are not in agreement or if we are referring to the individual members of the group, and not the group as whole use a plural verb. For example: *A pack of wolves was moving together. (use singular verb)*

*Team members were divided in deciding who shall lead them. (use plural verb)*

According to the rule, option A, B and D are wrong.
