EXPLANATION:

First find the relationship between the given pair of words, and then look for the pair of words among the answers that has the same relationship.

A CRUMB is a very small piece that falls from or breaks off from a piece of BREAD.

In choice (D), splinter is a very small piece that breaks off or splits away from a piece of wood. None of the relationships between the two words in the other choices is similar to the relationship between CRUMB and BREAD:

- · Candle emits light; it is not a small piece of a candle.
- Spark can cause fire. Fire is not a piece of a spark.
- · Hillock and mountain has a relationship of small and large.
- Milk is what butter is made from, but butter is not a small piece of Milk.

STRATEGIES

Explanation of the preceding example gives three clues:

- · You must know the meaning of the words.
- You should be able to express the relationship between the two words in the question in a test sentence.
- You should be able to express the relationship, in the correct answer, by using the test sentence for substituting the words.

To answer Analogy questions, start by making up a "test sentence" that expresses how the two words in the question are related. Then try to insert the words from each choice in your test sentence to see which pair makes the most sense.


